

PERSONAL PRONOUN

The personal pronoun is an essential element of language used to describe people or objects. The best way to define personal pronoun is that they are used in place of nouns to avoid repetition and prolong sentences. Personal pronouns reflect the referent's grammatical person (first, second, or third person), as well as its number (single or multiple).

We may use personal pronouns by avoiding repetition of terms and maintaining sentence coherence.
